

White Rose House



White Rose House is set in the peaceful village of Wheldrake, 8 miles from historic York. Originally the village primary school, the House was bought by Girlguiding North Yorkshire South and converted into an excellent multi-purpose facility for use by members of Girlguiding UK and other youth and community organisations. Opened in 1987, White Rose House has recently been extensively refurbished to a high standard.

The House is available for day hire and is suitable for a wide range of activities. Its excellent facilities include:

- A large hall and a small hall
- Seating and tables for no more than 100 people
- Fully-equipped catering kitchen
- Crockery for up to 40 people
- Washroom with toilets, washbasins and two showers
- Fully wheelchair accessible and suitable for the visually impaired
- Gas central heating (cost included in rent)
- Tarmac car park/play space to the rear of the building (with gates)

Information

First Aid

Users of White Rose House are expected to supply their own First Aid Kit. For emergency use there is a First Aid Box in the kitchen.

Fire Precautions

In the event of a fire, the fire exit is via the main door of the building OR the side door near the washroom. The fire alarm is on the wall in the entrance hall with full instructions on the wall nearby. There are fire extinguishers throughout the property

Health & Safety

Please note that for health and safety reasons, we are unable to permit the use of bouncy castles on the premises.

Booking Arrangements

The charge for hiring White Rose House is £ per hour. The full cost of the hire must be paid at the time of booking. All cheques should be made payable to The Guide Association, NYS, White Rose House.

Please check with the Booking Secretary that the dates you want are available before completing the booking form. If you would like to visit White Rose House before you book this can be arranged with the Booking Secretary.

Booking Conditions

1. The White Rose House Committee reserves the right to refuse any application to hire out the house without stating the reason for so doing.
2. The hirer shall be liable for all damage caused to the premises and for the payment or replacement of all breakages.
3. The premises must be left clean and tidy.
4. Care must be taken to ensure that no noise or nuisance to neighbours is created.
5. Guide Association Insurance ONLY covers members of Girlguiding UK. If you are a non Guide Association organisation YOU ARE NOT COVERED BY us and must arrange your own insurance cover for everything involved during your stay.
The Committee accepts no liability for damage to or loss of possessions.
6. Please note the premises are not licensed to sell alcohol.
7. In the event of a cancellation six weeks or less before the date of hire, we will do our best to re-let the premises but we reserve the right to charge for any expenses the cancellation may have caused.

Bookings will only be confirmed on receipt of the completed application form and payment. This should be within 10 days of receiving the form.
